!!BRINE BUILDING!!

District 3 is proud to invest in its own dedicated brine building, a critical step forward in strengthening our winter weather operations. By producing and storing brine in-house, we gain greater control over supply, timing, and application—ensuring our crews are fully prepared before storms hit. This proactive approach allows us to pretreat roads more effectively, reducing ice accumulation and improving overall safety for residents. It also eliminates reliance on outside sourcing during high-demand periods, when delays can impact response times.

This new facility will significantly streamline efficiency across all winter weather efforts. With brine readily available, our teams can deploy faster, cover more ground, and maintain safer road conditions with fewer resources. The result is not only quicker response times, but also cost savings and better long-term infrastructure protection. Investing in this capability reflects District 3's commitment to innovation, preparedness, and delivering reliable service to our community when it matters most.

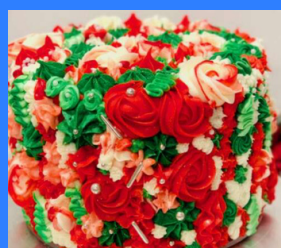

OKLAHOMA COUNTY DISTRICT 3- ROADS AND HIGHWAYS UPDATE

As we March forward (Pun Intended!) We are pushing for a strong finish to fiscal year 2025-26 at District 3. So far this year, we have rebuilt 6 roads with two more to go by June 30th. We also have stabilized one subgrade for Logan County and have one more to go. We are assisting them through our contracts to work together for the betterment of the communities where we live. We continue using cutting edge technology to achieve efficiency and quality improvements.

I mentioned last month that Randy Robinson from the Association of County Commissioners (ACCO) has put together a presentation on Oklahoma Roads and Bridges concerning where the money to build and repair those assets comes from and where it goes. I encourage everyone to look at this link to get a better understanding of where and how our tax money is utilized.

County Line 178th to 192nd

This project is now complete. This was a joint project paid for with funds from both the City of Piedmont and Oklahoma County

County Line 192nd to 206th

This project is in process. We anticipate it being completed soon. We are currently waiting on our stabilization contractor to complete work at Tinker Airforce Base for the Corp of engineers.

Westminster -Bridge south of Waterloo

Bad news on this section of Westminster Road as it remains closed. We are working with our Engineering group to develop a short- and long-term plan for this bridge. We have contracted with an engineering company to complete a hydrology and sub-surface (foundation) study before designs can be completed. This project continues to be delayed for various reasons, but we want it done correctly and safely. Thanks for all your patience.

Westminster -Bridge north of Highway 66

The contract for this project has been bid and the contract will be awarded next month. Construction should start thereafter. This will be an ODOT project and should take several months to complete. Westminster will be closed during the construction of this bridge, but it should be completed by the 1st quarter of 2027. More information will be provided as it becomes available.

Anderson Road- Highway 66 to Arcadia Town Limits

We have received a grant for this work, and we are planning to start work in May. We were delayed during our discussions with Edmond but the funds aren't currently available for continuing the rebuild of Anderson Road all the way to Covell. This project should begin in early May.
