

To qualify for the program, clients must have at least 1 of the following: (1) history of homelessness as a minor (2) history of DHS involvement (foster care or a prevention program) (3) history of parental incarceration when client was a minor (4) history of client incarceration (as a minor or adult) or (5) history of involvement with human trafficking.

They also provide case management services with a goal of helping our clients reach successful independent living, provides help with obtaining important documents (birth certificate, State ID, etc.), addresses any educational desires/needs (GED, high school, vocational, college) and help find employment (resume writing skills, job fairs, interview practice). They also have a strong focus on mental health and well-being. They help develop and strengthen independent living skills teach how to do laundry, grocery shop, budget, and clean apartment. They connect our participants to community resources, teach them how to

access those resources, so they can self-sustain once they are living independently. Participants can remain in the program for up to 2 years, or until they turn 25.
